

**Series: Mark (Jesus - the Son of God)**  
**Sermon: The Danger of Not Offering Forgiveness**  
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**Bible Verses: Mark 11:25**  
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Jesus says that if we *truly believe* we can ask for \_\_\_\_\_ in prayer and it will \_\_\_\_\_.

After promising answered prayer, Jesus immediately gives an important \_\_\_\_\_: if you are praying, and expect God to answer, you'd \_\_\_\_\_ instead of holding anything against them.

Jesus says we need to offer forgiveness so \_\_\_\_\_.

*Mercy is kindness shown towards an offender or someone indebted to another, such as \_\_\_\_\_ the debt.*

Untamed mercy is a passionate, \_\_\_\_\_, aggressive, even \_\_\_\_\_ mercy.
